### **CHERRY LOAF CAKE**

### **Ingredients:**

175g / 6oz Red or natural glace cherries 225g/ 8oz Self raising flour 175g/6oz Softened butter 175g/6oz Caster sugar Finely grated rind of 1 lemon 50g/2oz Ground almonds 3 large eggs

### **METHOD**

- 1. Preheat the oven to 180°C/160°C Fan/Gas Mark 4. Grease and line 2lb loaf tin
- 2. Cut the cherries into quarters, put in a sieve and rinse under running water. Drain well then dry thoroughly on kitchen paper.
- 3. Measure all the remaining ingredients into a large bowl and beat well for 1 minute to mix thoroughly. Lightly fold in the cherries. Turn into the prepared tin.
- **4.** Bake in the pre-heated oven for 1-1¼ hours or until well risen, golden brown and a skewer inserted into the centre comes out clean. Leave to cool in the tin for 10 minutes then turn out, peel off the parchment and finish cooling on a wire rack.

Class 59 Recipe

For the base
112g malted milk biscuits, crushed
100g milk chocolate
62g maltesers
80g butter
1½ tbsp golden syrup
½tbsp cocoa powder

For the topping

150g milk chocolate

50g maltesers (chop some for texture)

### Instructions:

- 1. Line a 1lb loaf tin
- 2. Crush the biscuits into fine crumbs, by placing them in a bag and smashing them with a rolling pin.
- 3. In a saucepan over low heat, melt together the butter, cocoa powder, golden syrup and milk chocolate, stirring constantly until smooth. Remove from the heat and allow it to cool for about 5 minutes.
- 4. Stir in the crushed biscuits making sure they're fully coated with the chocolate mixture. Gently fold in the maltesers
- 5. Press the mixture evenly into the prepared tin to form a solid base.
- 6. Melt topping chocolate in the microwave, stirring every 30 seconds until smooth and fully melted.
- 7. Pour the melted chocolate over the base and spread it evenly. Top with the remaining maltesers.

- 8. Place the tray bake in the fridge for at least two hours or until set. Once set, let it come to room temperature before cutting, to make it easier to slice.
- 9. Cut into squares and store in an airtight container at room temperature.
